## National Women's History Month Snapshot Nannie Helen Burroughs\*



Nannie Helen Burroughs was born on May 2, 1879 in Orange County, Virginia, the daughter of John Burroughs, farmer and Baptist preacher, and Virginia "Jennie" Poindexter Burroughs, homemaker.

After her parents' divorce in the early 1880s, Nannie and her mother relocated to Washington, DC and lived with her mother's older sister, Cordelia Mercer. Nannie attended the old M Street High School, which was later renamed Dunbar High School. It was here that she studied business and domestic science, and organized the Harriet Beecher Stowe Literary Society. She also met her role models in the suffrage and civil rights movement, Dr. Anna Julia Cooper and Mrs. Mary Church Terrell, at the school.

Upon graduating with honors from M Street High School in 1896, Nannie Helen Burroughs sought work as a Domestic Science teacher in the DC Public Schools, but was unable to find a position, because she was "too dark," as she was told. This ignited a zeal in her for the advocacy and uplifting of low-income Black women.

From 1898 to 1909, Nannie was employed in Louisville, Kentucky as an editorial secretary and bookkeeper for the Foreign Mission Board of the National Baptist Convention. During her time in Louisville, the Women's Industrial Club had been formed. Here, they held domestic science and management courses. Nannie Burroughs was one of the founders of the Women's Department of the National Baptist Convention, assisting with the Convention from 1900 to 1947. She was president of the Women's Department for thirteen of those years. She was also a very active member of the National Association of Colored Women (NACW), which was founded to draw the public's attention to the plight of African-American women. Nannie Burroughs was president, with other well-known women, such as vice president Mary McLeod Bethune and treasurer Maggie Lena Walker.

In 1909, Nannie Burroughs founded the National Training School for Women and Girls in Washington, DC as a boarding school, and opened with 35 students. Ms. Burroughs stressed the three B's: Bible, bath, and broom. Students were trained in domestic science, business, sewing, printing, barbering, and shoe repair. The school was independent; most of its funding came from individual and organizational contributions. The school also sustained itself through the operation of a laundry, the sale of student-made goods, and a summer school for women. Students were also required to take a Negro History class, using books owned by Ms. Burroughs's close colleague, Dr. Carter G. Woodson.

On May 20, 1961, Nannie Helen Burroughs died of natural causes. Her funeral was held at Nineteenth Street Baptist Church, where she was a member, and was attended by more than 5,000 people. She was buried in Lincoln Cemetery. In 1964, her training school was renamed the Nannie Helen Burroughs School in her honor, and in 1976, Deane Avenue in the Deanwood neighborhood of Washington, DC was renamed Nannie Helen Burroughs Avenue in her honor.
